Over the past years, WIUT has adopted the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals framework to support this core mission and to record, measure, and improve our contribution to a range of social, environmental, and economic outcomes.

This year, in the 2025 edition, WIUT was ranked in four SDGs by the Times Higher Education (THE) University Impact Rankings:

SDG 5 (Gender Equality) – 401–600th,

SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth) - 201-300th,

SDG 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions) – 101– 200th,

SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) - 301-400th.

Notably, WIUT ranked 1st in Central Asia for SDG 16: Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions, and 3rd in Central Asia for SDG 8: Decent Work and Economic Growth.



WIUT, as Uzbekistan's first UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network member and a key host of SDG initiatives, is a leading advocate for sustainability in the region. Every student, faculty, and staff member contributes to embedding the SDGs across teaching, research, and operations. Starting from the 2025/2026 academic year, all courses will integrate Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) principles, with each level including at least one core module focused on holistic sustainability, reinforced through assessments. Beyond the classroom, the campus has undergone a green renaissance: solar panels have now been installed on key buildings, water-filling stations have been installed as part of a broader initiative to reduce single-use plastics, with the ultimate aim of a plastic-free environment, and energy-efficient technologies have been integrated throughout.

Among other SDGs activities at WIUT are the annual Tashkent International Model UN Conference, Sustainable Business and Economic Integration Conference, UoW X WIUT SDG Summer School, and other research, capacity building and community activities.

SDGs Focus Areas

WIUT formally joined forces with UN in Uzbekistan for the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The declaration solidifies the existing cooperation between the two organisations and it also shows the way of partnership between the UN and the academic sector of Uzbekistan for creating a more sustainable and equitable future for the country where no citizen is left behind. The 17 SDGs enable us to frame and bring together our extensive collective energies towards helping our part in addressing the needs of region's labour markets and environmental challenges.

Graduate School

WIUT established the Graduate School in March 2020. Graduate School offers Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) and Doctor of Science (DSc) programmes Management (08.00.13)Econometrics & Statistics (08.00.06). The regulations, study and admission procedures based on the requirements of the Supreme Attestation Commission of the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Innovations of the Republic of Uzbekistan. graduate studies include full-time (independent part-time researcher) modes.



The Graduate School includes the Scientific Council, which is the decision-making body for dissertations defense. Beyond WIUT graduate students, PhD and candidates from local DSc universities defend their can dissertations at the Scientific Council of WIUT - currently in (08.00.13)Management Econometrics Statistics & (08.00.06) discipline.

Currently, the Graduate School hosts 13 full-time and 22 part-time students. Among them, 11 are in Econometrics & Statistics and 24 are in Management. Most of the part-time students are faculty members or researchers at local universities.


WIUT's Scientific Council is a unique model in the country, hosting both international and local senior researchers and academic advisors. This makes the growing supervisory capacity strong to facilitate further development of graduate education in Uzbekistan, integrating international standards.

Graduate Placement

2021 was the first defense at the Scientific Council of WIUT by Anvar Gafurov, who received PhD degree Management. Dr. Gafurov is currently working in one of the private universities of Uzbekistan. In 2023, WIUT's Finance Department faculty member Temur Makhkamov defended his PhD dissertation in Management. In 2023, Dr. Binoy Joy Kattadiyil, India, defended his DSc dissertation. He is currently working in both academia and a private sector. In 2024, WIUT PhD candidates Zamira Ataniyazova and Nilufar Rakhimova (Management), along with Munisa Turdibaeva (Econometrics & Statistics), have successfully received their PhD degrees.

WIUT Research Clusters

Our research clusters reflect key research focus areas within each school and provide a platform for developing multidisciplinary research links, as well as for connecting research with practice. Within each group, our faculty members undertake innovative empirical research and knowledge exchange activities. This also includes collaborations with private and public sectors with the support of WIUT's research and training centers and labs (CPRO, CPLE and innoWIUT). International investment law

The group investigates broader objects that can qualify as investments as well as qualification of investors within the corporate structures in MNE and NCE. Outlining the scope of substantive standards as FET and FPS are also at the center of attention. The role of a national legal framework in investment regulation, including investment facilitation is another raising imperative in international investment law. The role of 61TS and MITs in investment protection, as well as customary international law, is one of the main topics of review. The diagnosis of the ISDS system and improving investment dispute resolution is another essential topic of attention of the research record.

Center for Policy Research and Outreach (CPRO)









Since 2021, WIUT students have competed at the Bloomberg Trading Challenge that tests students annually on generating the highest relative profit and loss return (P&L) via the Bloomberg Terminal. In 2021, five WIUT BSc Finance students were ranked 14th globally, 4th in Asia and 5th in the world by country representation. In 2022, WIUT students ranked 6th regionally and 26th globally. In 2023, WIUT Team was ranked 1st in Uzbekistan and 23rd globally. In 2024, our top-performing team, DT Capital, achieved an outstanding 39th place globally, placing them in the top ~1% of all participants. They also ranked 1st in Central Asia and 4th in Asia (by country)

Research Funding

UoW and WIUT Research Collaboration Fund

WIUT undertakes collaborative research with the University of Westminster (London) through the UoW-WIUT Joint Research Collaboration Scheme. This research support programme promotes institutional cooperation and focuses on developing scholarly research helping WIUT and UoW faculty members develop their areas of specialisation as well as new areas of interdisciplinary research. 37 supported projects since 2017

Internal Research Grant

The objective of the Internal Research Grant is to encourage development of research projects to stimulate disciplinary and interdisciplinary research within and between different faculties of the university, and to produce high-quality research findings. The grant scheme particularly aims:



WIUT produces evidence-based reports and policy recommendations to support socio-economic development of Uzbekistan and other Central Asian countries.





Research Publication Bonus Scheme

From April 2024, the University announced its new publications rewarding scheme to support university's research productivity in terms of quantity and quality. The scheme particularly encourages publication in Q1 and Q2 journals indexed in Scopus or Web of Science.

In 2024, 71 Articles out of 153 are published by WIUT staff in Scopus

Most assistants continue their postgraduate studies in European and North American universities.






Visiting Researcher Fellowship

Annual Big Research Events

WIUT annually hosts research conferences, summer & winter schools, and other research focused big events. Such events aim to create discussion platforms for research communities and interested stakeholders to share their knowledge and experiences and to discuss further research developments.

Summer and Winter Schools

We organize "summer" and "winter schools" to support capacity development in evidence based research amongst students and faculty members. Research summer schools include "Research Methods for Young Sociologists", and "Summer/Winter School on Applied Econometric Analysis for Young Economists". WIUT's summer schools also include student exchange programs such as "Go East Summer School" funded by DAAD, and "UoW X WIUT SDG Summer School".





Research Seminars & Research Training Sessions

Research Seminars

Research Seminars are a place where faculty members, research assistants, and students share completed research and works in progress. They receive valuable feedback to strengthen their research preparing them for conference presentations or publication. On occasion, visiting researchers from outside the University share their work.

Participants learn much from understanding how research questions are developed, a study is designed, and the process of collecting, analysing, and presenting findings and conclusions. Research seminars are hosted by all Schools of WIUT. The School of Business & Economics hosts the Research Colloquium series every Wednesday.



Research

Research fraining sessions cover philosophy of research, design, posing questions, quantitative and qualitative data collection and analysis methods, and drawing conclusions and publishing results, including both theoretical and practical sessions. Practical sessions are supported with research tools for quantitative and qualitative data analysis including STATA, NVivo, and other useful software for researchers such as LaTeX.

Forum for Uzbek and Silk Road Studies

The Forum for Uzbek and Silk Road Studies (FUSRS) provides a dynamic platform for debate and discussion over contemporary developments in Uzbekistan, Central Asia and the broader Silk Road region. The Forum seeks to be inclusive, engaging with all those interested in the region, and to further international understanding of what is happening along the Silk Road.

The Forum is a joint initiative between Westminster International University in Tashkent (WIUT) and the University of Westminster in London (UoW). These two institutions have enjoyed a fruitful and mutually beneficial partnership in which joint research activities have been developed.



The Forum was inaugurated in 2021 so as to profile this research collaboration more effectively and to share the synergies that derive from it with the wider research community.

The Forum exists in parallel in London and Tashkent and also comes together in shared research events during the course of the year. As well as focusing on Uzbekistan, the Forum explores issues relating to the wider Eurasia region, supported by the University of Westminster Press Silk Road Journal.



Research Portal is a centralized record of the research output of the University's academic community. Most of the services provided by the Graduate School (Research) are accessible through the portal (some services are at the development stages).



Research Governance









Research Ethics

Research in social sciences is often concerned with collecting data from people. This raises questions about the way in which people who provide data should be treated by researchers, and such questions are often ethical in nature.

The University has policies and procedures in place relating to Research Ethics. WIUT's Research Ethics Panel is a part of the University Research Development Standing Committee. Its primary focus is to consider general ethical issues concerning research activities (such as primary data collection, surveys, focus group discussions, etc) undertaken by University staff, students, other individuals or organizations working with the University, in accordance with the Research Ethics Policy.

Any research involving human participants, personal data or human tissue applications must be submitted via the online system for ethical approval. Each application form for Research Ethics Panel consideration shall be reviewed by at least three members of Panel and response to applicant the result of the review shall be provided within a specific period in the policy.

Applications from undergraduate and postgraduate students are reviewed by respective supervisors / subject area experts.
